

ITS Work Experience...



- Purpose: To build work readiness skills (hard and soft)
 necessary for students to obtain and maintain entry level employment
 - Benefits/Outcomes
 - -Provides development of hard and soft skills
 - -Provides experiences when answering interviewing questions
 - Promotes community partnerships

Provide VR services to eligible YTP participants

ITS Services vs. YTP Services

What IEP Services are...

Eligible for IEP services through age 21 IF services are needed and wanted

- * Instruction in areas of:
 - >Employment
 - >Job Getting & Keeping Skills
 - >Work Experience
 - >Independent living
 - >Short term mobility trng.
 - >Banking & Budgeting
 - >Money handling
 - >Driver's manual
- * Services are not "touch and go"
- * Learn the skills in class, apply the skills independently out of class

What YTP Services are . . .

Student has a barrier to employment
Student must meet the eligibility requirements of
Vocational Rehabilitation Services.

* With learning disability, at least a 15 pt. discrepancy between cognitive and achievement scores

- * Students who, with a *time-limited* set of planned services, will be able to successfully enter and *keep* competitive employment
- * YTP Grant funds a part time summer program

ITS Services vs. YTP Services

What IEP Services are NOT:

- * **Not required** or **automatic** (student must want & actively participate)
- * Not a job placement / employment service We don't "get" students jobs!

What YTP Services are . . .

Employment – We DO provide more *intensive* individualized instruction and assistance with:

- 1. Service time & service dollars for those in "plan"
- 2. Job searching & resume development
- 3. Completing job applications
- 4. Interview preparation
- 5. Connecting with community agencies such as:
 - Employment office
 - Private employment agencies
- 6. Assisting with job coaching as needed

What YTP Services are NOT:

Not a job placement agency - don't "get" jobs!

CTS Structure

- Who: Student population and staffing
- What: Community-based activities and curriculum
- When: Multiple and flexible schedules
- Where: Satellite locations close to public transportation
- How: Collaboration and staff training



In-District Connections

- Student Services: Consultant support and department budget
- High Schools: Professional Learning Communities (PLCs)
- Transportation: District busing and Tri-Met passes
- Other Departments: Work experience opportunities within the district



Community Connections

- Adult Service Agencies: Referral, collaboration, contracts
