COSA Legislative Priorities

2021 Session - Budget

- COSA Goal State School Fund: \$9.6 billion
 - Final Budget: \$9.3 billion (SB 5514)
- COSA Goal Protect Student Success Act Investments
 - Final Budget for Student Investment Account (SIA): \$892 million
 - Final Budget for High School Success (M98): \$311 million
 - ESDs supporting SSA: \$41.1 million
 - Additional Equity Initiative Investments: \$22 million
- K-12 Facilities Investments
 - OSCIM: \$125 million; Seismic Grants: \$110 million; Broadband: \$17.5 million
- Key Grant in Aid Funding Regional Programs and YCEP/JDEP
 - Regional Programs: \$65.2 million; YCEP/JDEP: \$8 million increase (SB 5513)
