Parent Teacher Home Visits



The concept behind the Parent/Teacher Home Visits non-profit is simple.

Teachers and families come together, in a unique setting, as equal partners, to build trust and form a relationship.

This strategy creates space for key partners to share dreams, expectations, experiences, and, eventually, tools to boost academic and social success.

IN THE PAST YEAR:

*PTHVP trained **5,000** teachers.

*We expanded to **400** participating schools in **19** states.

*Together, we conducted **31,000** relational home visits.

PTHVP in Multnomah County



- 2014
 - 8 R4K Collaborative Demo Sites Conducted “Off Site Family Outreach”
 - Reached out to PTHVP- Information session sponsored by Multnomah Co. SUN and Early Learning Multnomah (ELM)

- 2015
 - Spring Trainings held by ELM & Children’s Institute- over 125 participants
 - Application developed for Kinder Teacher Family Visits, 19 sites launched
 - Gear Up and Portland Public Schools come on board

- 2016
 - Train the Trainer Session sponsored by ELM
 - Local training teams launch
 - 28 Schools participating in visits

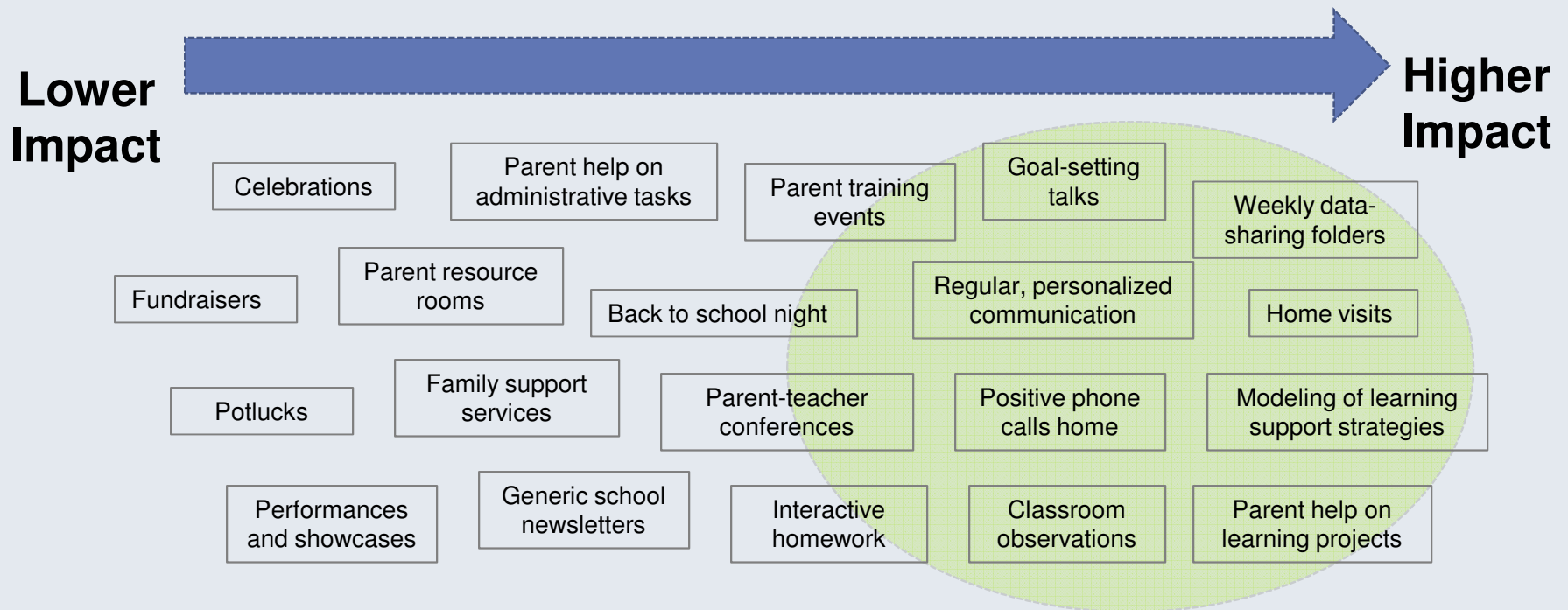

Parent Teacher Home Visit Outcomes



For Staff and Families:

- ◆ Increased Trust and Empathy for Co-Educator
- ◆ Increased Capacity To Better Engage Student in Academics

For Students:

- ◆ Increased student attendance rates
- ◆ Increased academic success for students
- ◆ Decreased suspension and expulsion rates
- ◆ Increase in applying to 2 or 4 year colleges
