

Timeline for Achieving

The law for High School Success outlines a variety of foundational elements, or eligibility requirements that are required of every recipient, regardless of funding level. These eligibility requirements must be fully in place by the end of the 2019-2021 biennium.

□ Rubric

Eligibility Requirement Scenarios

- 1. Each table will be given a school scenario and the section of the rubric that pertains to that eligibility requirement.
- 2. As a table group:
 - a. Brainstorm how, as school leaders, you could work to "bump" your district up to the next level on the rubric.
 - b. Explicitly explain how improving these practices will foster equitable learning outcomes for the students the district serves.
 - c. Be prepared to share out.





Eligibility Requirement #1--

Teacher Collaboration Time Around Data:

Provide sufficient time for teachers and staff of students in grade 9 to review data on students' grades, absences, and discipline by school and course.

Eligibility Requirement #2--

Equitable Assignment to Advanced Courses: Assign students to advanced and dual-credit courses based on academic qualifications in order to avoid bias

Eligibility Requirement #3--

Practices to Reduce Chronic Absenteeism: Implement district-wide evidence-based practices to reduce chronic absenteeism

Eligibility Requirement #4--

Systems Ensuring On-Time

Graduation:Implement systems to ensure that high school students, including English Language Learners, are taking courses required for on-time graduation

Eligibility Requirement #5--

Partnerships: Develop partnerships and consult with federally recognized Oregon Indian Tribes

□ Item Numbers on Rubric: #29-32
