Year 2 Outcomes

- All District AMAOs met for the first time since 2010-11 School Year
 - From 2013-14 to 2014-15, Percent of Students Meeting AMAO1 grew from 37% to 60%
- Teacher Driven Sheltered Instruction
 Initiative in Math Planned for 2015-16
- Vertically Aligned 1st-5th Scope & Sequence
