

1. Increase bilingual skills and comfort level for all participants, therefore leading to increased communication.

2. An opportunity for authentic, relationship-based parent engagement between parents and school staff members.

How it works...

- People (parents, teachers, school community members) come together to practice Spanish and English for an hour each week in a comfortable, encouraging environment.
- Simple games and materials enhance the language acquisition process and connections between participants.
- Typically, the hour is spent ½ in Spanish, ½ in English.






