Poverty in Oregon Schools

According to the US Census, 15.5% of Oregonians were living below the poverty level for 2008-2012. In 2013, the Annie E. Casey Foundation ranked Oregon 41st in child economic well-being with 45% of Oregon children living in households that devote more than 30% of their income to housing costs, compared with 40% of children nationally.

A 2014 study by Children First for Oregon found about 44% of children were poor or low income. Of those children, 23.4% or 382,542 were living at or below the federal poverty line (using 2011 data). That is about 23.4% of children, up from 21.7% in 2010 and 19.4% in 2009. [2]
