<b><u>Earlier Oppressive Practice</u></b>	<b><u>Current School Practice</u></b>
1. Containment of Black bodies on enslavement plantations	Normalizing the practice of sending Black students to in-school suspension spaces
2. Forcing Native Americans to enroll in “Indian Schools” to cleanse them of their Indigenous culture	Preventing Native American students from congregating in a school space
3. Placing Japanese Americans in Internment Camps	Allowing students to languish in ESL spaces, even when they are already proficient in English
4. Lynching Black men, women, and children because of White fears	Cultural or racial shaming of Black students in school
5. Beating immigrants for speaking native languages in school	Shaming and harassing immigrants for speaking native languages in school
