## Welcome to Wallowa!

The Wallowa School District is home to about 200 students and is served by 38 staff members of which 21 are licensed employees, 14 classified employees, 1 confidential employee, and 2 administrators. The elementary school, middle school, and high school reside on the same campus, which provides a unique opportunity for collaboration and unity between students and staff. Small class sizes provide students with a high level of support and Wallowa staff pride themselves on knowing their students and families well.

The District has a general fund budget of about \$4.1 million and passed a capital improvement bond of \$7M in 2021 and received a \$4M matching state grant.

Wallowa High School is the only accredited high school in Wallowa County. The district has received recognition for strong CTE and Career Pathways Programming, including Health Occupations,

Students are released early on Monday afternoons to provide time for teacher PLC teams to meet, review student learning and plan for intervention and enrichment. RTI work embraces PBIS and prevention in addition to academics.
